## Discharge Planning & Instruction

- 1. To outline discharge guidelines for the safe release a patient from the Emergency Department (ED) to his/her responsible parent/legal guardian(s), receiving facility, law enforcement, social services, or self.
- 2. To assure that patient and/or legal guardian are informed and educated about the diagnosis, after care instructions, medications prescribed (if applicable), follow-up, and reasons to return to the Emergency Department when discharged.
- 3. For a patient to be discharged to a person not having legal custody, and a parent/legal guardian cannot be reached for consent for discharge, a nonparent/guardian, adult relative with whom a minor is living with must have previously signed the Caregiver's Authorization Affidavit.
- 4. A parent may also send a signed consent identifying the person authorized to be responsible for the patient at time of discharge.
- 5. California law requires confidentiality for patients 12 years of age and older for health information pertaining to services which the minor is authorized to consent.
  - a. This generally covers health care related to sexual relations, drug usage, and/or mental health services. Married, self-sufficient, or emancipated minors have a privacy right for all health information.
- 6. If phone consent needs to be obtained, two members of the hospital staff must verify that they are speaking with the patient's parent/legal guardian.
- 7. Consent to transfer to another facility requires written consent by parent or legal guardian.
- 8. A minor child cannot be released to another minor child.
- 9. Exception: A parent, who is a minor, may pick up his/her own child.
- 10. Families are provided education on the need for appropriate car safety restraints upon discharge.
- 11. If English is not the patient or parent/legal guardian's primary language, an interpreter, as available, will be utilized to interpret the discharge instructions and patient/family education provided by the RN/LIP.

## 12. Discharge Process

- a. RN reviews discharge instructions and, if appropriate for patient discharge diagnosis and complete, prints a copy of the instructions.
- b. RN provides discharge instructions, completes discharge teaching, and answers patient and parent/legal guardian questions,
- c. RN will provide prescription(s) to patient/parent/legal guardian.
- d. The complete copy of the discharge instructions is provided to the patient or parent/legal guardian.
- e. Patient or parent/legal guardian and RN sign the signature page of the discharge instructions.
- f. Check to see that patient and family have all personal belongings, discharge instructions, and prescription(s), if applicable
- g. RN completes the discharge in the Electronic Medical Record
